

Visiting Scholarship (PostDoc)

The European Union Academic Programme Hong Kong (EUAP) is inviting applications for a Visiting Scholarship at the postdoc level for research/teaching sojourns of four months duration (one semester) at EUAP institutions in Hong Kong (fall/winter term 2014).

The EUAP is a consortium of four universities in Hong Kong (Hong Kong Baptist University, The University of Hong Kong, The Chinese University of Hong Kong and Lingnan University), co-financed by the European Commission. It is designed to strengthen EU-Hong Kong relations through academic work and enhance the understanding of the EU in Asia. It cooperates closely with the diplomatic representatives of the EU and EU member states as well as European chambers of commerce and a large number of institutions in Europe.

Applications are now invited in the following area:

• European Urban Geography

(Social, economic, cultural and intercultural aspects, with an emphasis on innovation concepts and urban management in large cities/urban agglomerations)

Successful applicants are expected to contribute to academic research and teaching in participating institutions, development of outreach activities, in particular briefing sessions for selected target audiences in Hong Kong political circles, civil society, business and the mass media, as well as conferences. The emphasis will be on communicating and interpreting current EU developments to selected target audiences. The applicant should also be able to contribute to establishing/strengthening academic cooperation between HK and Europe.

The position is suitable in particular for younger researchers who would like to gain more experience in the public and academic discourse between the EU

Extremely good communication skills in English and willingness to cooperate flexibly with university and non-academic partners are a must.

Review of applications will begin by mid-April 2014 and will continue until the position is filled. The envisaged starting date for the Visiting Scholar is 1 September 2014.

Successful applicants will receive a monthly stipend plus accommodation allowance to cover living expenses and an additional travel allowance to/from Hong Kong.
