Dr. Hungdah SU is now professor and Jean Monnet Chair of the Department of Political Science at National Taiwan University and the Director General of the European Union Centre in Taiwan. He is an undeniable expert in the EU and regional integration, having taught these subjects for more than a decade. He holds a B.A. from NTU, an M.A. from Cheng Chi University, and a Doctorat from University of Paris-Sorbonne (Paris IV), and is a member of the Council of Jean Monnet Foundation for Europe since November 2005. He began his career at Nan Hua University of Chia-yi in 1998 and then at the Institute of European and American Studies of the prestigious Academia Sinica (Chinese Academy of Science in Taipei), where he served as coordinator of EU Study Team between 2006 and 2008. Since August 2008, he works as a faculty member of NTU and has contributed substantially to creation of the EU Centre in Taiwan, of which he served as executive director until October 2010 and is, since then, the deputy director general. His recent research focus is on the CFSP Law and Comparative Regionalism in Asia and Europe.
