

## **Presenting EUROculture**

The University of Göttingen Euroculture team is proud to present to you the Euroculture Master of Arts programme. Euroculture is a unique, transdisciplinary and interuniversity Master of Arts Programme recognised by the European Commission as an *Erasmus Mundus Master of Excellence*. Its aim is to prepare graduates from all over the world for professions and research areas in which knowledge of present-day Europe and European Union institutions is of relevance.

## **The Content of the Programme**

The focus of the Programme is on cultural and social developments, the political process of European integration, values, citizenship and cultural identity. The Programme teaches students the methods and skills required to identify social problems in Europe, to collect and process relevant information on European institutions and organizations, and to critically reflect on the cultural aspects and factors that play a role in the process of European identity formation and European integration. It does not only allow for transnational cross-over comparisons of relevant concepts and their understanding in different regions in the world, but also acquaints Euroculture students with different cultural settings. These settings are of key importance for the development of good understanding of current debates on European integration.

## **The Structure of the Programme**

The Programme is taught in English at eight renowned European universities (Göttingen, Groningen, Deusto (Bilbao), Kraków, Olomouc, Strasbourg, Udine, Uppsala) and four non-European universities (México City, Pune, Osaka, Indiana). It is open to students who have successfully obtained at least a Bachelor's degree in the fields of European Studies, History, Theology, Literature, Philosophy, International Relations, Political Science, Economics, Cultural studies, Anthropology, Psychology, Law or Sociology, leading to the Master of Arts joint-degree in Euroculture.

The mandatory mobility between the different consortium universities is a crucial element of the Euroculture Programme. Through its international exchange, the Euroculture Programme offers students the chance to gain valuable academic and personal experiences within divergent multicultural and multilingual contexts. Additionally, by giving the students the option of following either a research track or a professional track (i.e. an internship) during the third semester, the programme caters to the students' individual interests and future career plans.

The extended application deadline is September 1<sup>st</sup> 2014 for non-EU students and September 15<sup>th</sup> 2014 for EU-students.
